Video Ganes

This year it's a whole new ballgame for the video games shopper. While there are fewer products to choose from than there were last year, most of the games available now are based on highly sophisticated computer-based systems. They offer the player lots of new options, including sound effects and the convenience of using the hardware, or equipment, for applications beyond game-playing.

You can buy games that will talk back to you, provide you with the roar of the crowd when you score, give you 4-player capability, or allow you to progress through as many as eight levels of skill. Besides the usual sports and target games, you'll also find logic puzzles to solve, board games like chess, checkers and backgammon, casino games and educational cartridges for the kids. Some of the new products also offer technical innovations such as high-resolution graphics for better detail, color in 256 gradations, simulated sound, and three-part "harmony.


Most of the game systems are "programmable," which means that you can add on, or plug in, a variety of optional games that come on cassettes or cartridges. You can also create new games in some cases. On the other hand, the less flexible pre-wired games come only with their own selection of built-in games and have no capacity for add-on options.


All the new programmable video games are based on micro-processing technology using miniature computers. Some of them are designed so they can also operate as home computers. They can assist you with your budgetkeeping, aid you in preparing your tax returns, or help you learn speed reading. Certain games can teach you how to talk to a computer in the machine language called BASIC. Others inciude features like alpha-numeric (typewriter keyboards) or vocal input with a mike attachment. When connected to your audiocassette recorder, some of the systems also allow you to store new programs that you create vourself.

Prices range from approximately \$20 for a pre-wired game to over \$300 for a more advanced system. After you read through the specifications here, visit dealers who can demonstrate these games for you. Or, if you can, try them out for yourself in the store. Beyond the cost of the equipment you buy, you'll probably find yourself investing in many an hour of creative interaction with whichever games you purchase

Home Lonnuers

In some ways, buying a home computer is like investing in a car. First, you want to find the best machine you can afford. Then you want to consider those extra options that may cost you more but should also give you better value in the long run. You also want to buy a model that can be easily repaired if necessary. A few questions to consider: Can the machine be upgraded to increase its power? To perform additional functions? To store more information?

A computer, like an audio- or videotape, stores information in the sequence in which it was recorded. But many home computers have a feature known as RAM (Random Access Memory), which gives them the capacity to bring forth the data you want instantly, without wading through sequential information stored ahead of it. Measured in "bytes," or units of information, the storage capacities of computer memories vary. A computer with an 8K (for kilo, or thousand) memory can store 8000 bytes; a machine with a 32K memory can store 32,000 of these units. Computers listed in this Guide have memories ranging in storage capacity from 4,000 to 64,000 bytes. As a rule, the less expensive, lower-level computers store this information on cassettes, while the higher-priced, more advanced models use disks. Disks have a much higher storage capacity than cassettes and so push up the prices of the computers that include them.

With an RF adaptor, most home computers can display information on an ordinary TV screen. Some come with monitors or video terminals of their own. A lot of them can also be attached to printers, but print-outs from a home computer can be an expensive option, costing in some cases more than the computer system itself. Not all printers are compatible with all computers, so it's important to find out from the manufacturer which printer will work best with the machine you plan to buy. Though some companies will sell you printers you can use with their machines, most makers of computers do not produce printers of their own.

In general, most home computers are compact and lightweight. Often the computer, together with a keyboard, weighs less than 5 pounds and measures as little as 15" wide by 10" deep and only 2" high. But consoles that also include video terminals may weigh up to 50 pounds and take up nearly 4 cubic feet of space. Prices, too, will vary, depending upon which components and memory features the machine offers. But most of the computers described in this BUYER'S GUIDE are priced

When confronted with so many aspects to consider, you'll probably wish you already had a computer to figure out which model you should buy. The only way to pick out the right one for you is to determine first what your own price range and needs are. Then begin looking for the machine that best serves them.


